
Thoughts and Suggestions for Dairy Farmers

There are a lot of variables on a farm, especially on a dairy farm. Always keep watching for limiting factors. I was recently reminded about stray voltage, by a farmer's experience with cows not milking out evenly, high somatic cell counts, cows off-feed, especially fresh cows. They spent a lot of time and money upgrading the vacuum system. After installing a stray voltage detector, and correcting fencing issues, things have greatly improved. Bill Roberts says "Based on testing stray voltage on over 2600 farms, the #1 cause of stray voltage is the electric fencer. Ninety five percent of farms tested with an electric fencer have stray voltage that is affecting the cattle to some degree." Voltage detectors cost around \$300 from Bill Roberts (315-794-5324) and are easy to install.

As of 5/27/21, these strawberries are just over the peak and yield to-date is at 1.75 qt. per plant.

GROWING TIPS

Corn root worms are an issue on some farms: this usually indicates compaction or poor biology. Root worm larvae emerge from the soil around June 10 to June 20. Monitor closely by digging some roots.

DAIRY

Having trouble with leafhoppers? The goal should be to have nutrient levels so balanced that you can do without pesticides. Taking a sap test once a year can help you determine limiting factors for yield and quality.

PRODUCE

Be proactive! Use foliars regularly (once or twice a week) as a system for increasing brix levels.

ORCHARD

Now is the time to reduce biannual bearing. Use sap tests to determine where the limiting factors are. Foliar feed Accelerate.

GREENHOUSE

Use shade cloth to keep your greenhouses under 80° once warm weather sets in. This can help prevent insect infestations.



Take a soil test if you have a problem garden. Diseases and insects indicate compacted soils, nutrient imbalances, or poor biology.
